What is a Registered Apprenticeship?

- A registered apprenticeship is a training program designed to meet the needs of an employer by providing the employee with structured on-the-job learning, related instruction, and a progressive wage scale.
- Registered apprentices earn state and national credentials certifying their skills.
- Participants are cross-trained on all aspects of their MOS/Rating.
- Apprenticeships are a unique and rewarding pathway to develop workplace and occupational skills.
- A proven apprenticeship model has been validated by the U.S. Department of Labor(USDOL) and a State Apprenticeship Agency.

Benefits of enrolling in the NCNG Registered Apprenticeship Program

- The program is *free* and requires *no* off-duty hours
- Become more marketable for future employment with a Nationally Recognized Credential
- Obtain documented proof of work experience earned
- Receive recognition for skills learned
- Gain work experience and build self-esteem
- Good for a lifetime

Did you know?

- 1937 Congress enacted the National Apprenticeship Act known as the Fitzgerald Act
- NCNG Registered Apprenticeship Program was approved in 2013
- Military personnel can register to join the apprenticeship program
- NCNG Registered Apprenticeship Program has nearly 100 registered occupations
